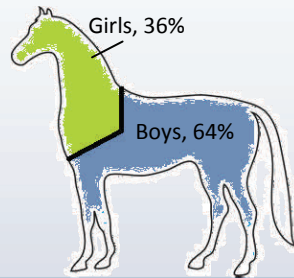
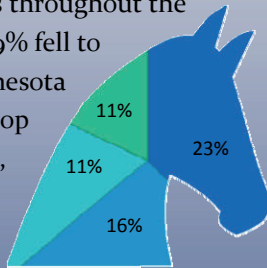


Children's Program

Statistics for 2014

This year we had 75 riders participate in our classes. Due to inclement weather we had to cancel several classes throughout the year, but make up classes or refunds were arranged for those riders.

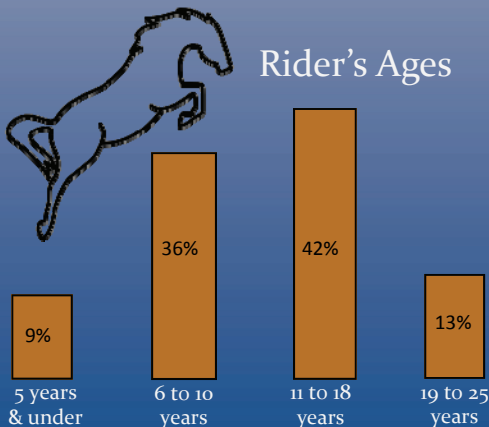
- While over 29 different diagnoses were present in our riders, below are the 4 that affected over 70% of those that participated.
 1. Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)
 2. Attention deficit disorder / Attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADD/ADHD)
 3. Developmental Delay (DD)
 4. Cerebral palsy (CP)
- We offered classes to riders throughout the 7 county metro area, but 89% fell to the cities south of the Minnesota River. Of those cities, the top 4 are shown here: Lakeville, Apple Valley, Burnsville, & Eagan.



Laura P. & Brenda S. taught Tuesday and Wednesday classes, Gay U. & Sue A. assisted our instructors on Tuesday & Thursdays. Mary S. volunteered on Mondays and Thursdays as a Barn Aide.

The summer long Pilot Program offered by Mary S. & her miniature horse Riley on ground work was attended by 2 students that learned the ins and outs of handling horses.

Heroes on Horseback Veteran's Program

- Total amount of visits and hours for those that participated in the **MHR Heroes on Horseback Program: 270 visits / 682.75 hours**

- 94% of our veterans were male; 6% were female
- While over dozens of different diagnoses were present, below are a few that affected many of the riders that participated with the programs.
 - ◆ Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI)
 - ◆ Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)
 - ◆ Anxiety Disorder
 - ◆ Major Depression
 - ◆ Chemical/Alcohol Dependency
- We worked closely with several military organizations and most riders were referred by the following groups:

55%	Outpatient Referrals
26%	Veterans' Home—Hastings Branch
14%	Veterans' Home—Minneapolis Branch
5%	VA Medical Center

Program Review:

- Heroes on Horseback hired a new Program Director for the riding season: PATH certified instructor Jen Espinoza. She increased our riders knowledge and challenged their skill levels.
- The Veterans had the experience of ground driving Molly the pony, both in the arena and out on the trail. This work and more in 2015 will prepare our riders for driving of our carriage.
- Independent reining, obstacle courses, groundwork, and trail rides around the property were all worked on during classes.

We had over 275 volunteers helping out with our riding programs, special events, & projects.

Children's Program = 3700 hours

Veteran's Program = 1150 hours

Events / Projects = 1120 hours

Total Volunteer Hours = 5970 Hours

Our Horses

MHR owns 15 horses, of which 13 are used in our riding programs plus 3 privately owned horses are used for select classes. In 2014 these 16 horses had a total of 1200 rider hours throughout the season and 15 hours were spent pulling our hay wagon for parades and rides.

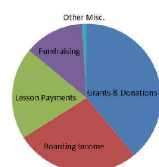

2014 Annual Report

Mission: To provide children & young adults with special needs as well as injured military veterans (active & retired) the opportunity to achieve a sense of freedom, accomplishment, and increased self-esteem while giving their families hope through the use of Equine Assisted Activities and Therapies.

Year in review:

- MHR held 2 major fundraisers in 2014, the 3rd annual Ride-A-Thon during the summer as well as the Autumn Blaze Gala Event in October. Both were well attended and the programs were able to raise almost \$30,000 combined to go towards the care and upkeep of our programs and horses. We also had a couple of smaller fundraisers including a very successful weekend selling bratwursts at VonHanson's Meats of Savage.
- The Visually Impaired Veterans of the State of Minnesota came to the ranch for an afternoon of relaxation. They toured the facility, met the horses, and a couple of them even took up the reins for a ride.
- We had several groups out to help at the ranch this year, including some very hard workers from the Toro Company, the Lakeville Area Public Schools Community Education Department had a group of students help out this fall, the Boy Scouts built us some beautiful benches for around the arena, and the Savage Women's Correctional Facility brought out a group to help us get ready for winter. Without all of this help we wouldn't have been able to accomplish as much as we did.
