- 2019 began much earlier in the year than we have ever been able to do before—thanks to our newly completed & insulated indoor arena. We were able to have a small pilot program of riders in January through March (weather dependent) and they enjoyed riding on our incredibly fuzzy program horses.
- We welcomed not only Shanelle as a new instructor, but also Liz Zelles joined us teaching on Monday nights before going off to college. We look forward to having her back as an instructor once she finishes up her degree!
- ♦ 2 new horses joined our programs this year: Khan (a gypsy vanner that replaced Nessie in our program) and Shooter (a paint horse that will help Princess and Marshall with adult sized riders.) Both horses are doing well with our riders now that they are learning what their jobs entail.
- We utilized the indoor arena all season, and it allowed us to ride when there was rain (though not thunderstorms), when it was hot (thanks to those wonderful FANS!) and into the fall, when it gets so dark for the last class. We also shared the arena time with both programs, and we thank riders and families for being flexible on those days.
- We had our first event since the construction—and everyone enjoyed the music of the FunFest! featuring the Teddy Bear Band. We look forward to having more events at the Ranch!

2019 FUNDRAISING



MAJESTIC HILLS RANCH FOUNDATION – A veteran shares the results he experienced by riding in our Heroes on Horseback Program in 2019, which provides equine-assisted activities and therapies for injured armed forces personnel, active duty and veterans in rehabilitation.

Sunday morning at 10:25 AM I heard my phone beep letting me know that I had received an email. Upon checking my phone, this is what I read and wanted to share this great news with everyone; "Good morning Larry. My name is Tom Riley. I was lucky enough to participate in the Heroes on Horseback program at Majestic Hills Ranch. I want to thank you for such an amazing program and experience. Since beginning the sessions, I have been nearly free from nightmares! I am truly amazed at the power of horses!

My wife Patti and I went on a trail ride yesterday with Dawn from HHH Ranch. I was talking about my best buddy Caleb (MHR Horse). It turns out that Caleb used to be boarded there! They knew exactly who he was by how I described him & then I showed them his pictures! It's a small world!!

I hope to be able to participate next year with the program. I tell every veteran I know or meet with PTSD about the power of horses. My life has been changed forever! I can't express enough gratitude for what your program has done for me. Talking with James, the other veteran with the program, the program probably saved his life!

Thank you so much, for such an amazing opportunity! I'm looking forward to next year and I hope that I can come out and visit soon!"

(As a footnote) * Tom was diagnosed with stage IV metastatic ocular melanoma four and a half years ago. He's a US Navy veteran and fought during Operation Desert Storm, where he was exposed to nerve agents, burn pits and other toxins which caused his cancer.



STATISTICS FOR 2019

Children's Program

- Total number of riders served by the **Children's Program**: 75 Participants in **Horse Sense Psychotherapy** Sessions: 12
 - 3% 5 years old or under
 - 32% Between ages 6 and 10 years old
 - 45% Between ages 11 and 18 years old
 - 30% Over 19 years
- 57% were male; 43% were female
- While over 43 different diagnoses were present in our riders, below are the 4 that affected a majority of our riders.
 - 1. Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)
 - 2. Developmental Delay (DD)
 - Attention deficit disorder / Attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADD/ADHD)
 - 4. Cerebral palsy (CP)
- We offered classes to riders throughout the metro area and surrounding counties, but 88% lived in the cities south of the Minnesota River. Of those cities, the top 3 are:

Lakeville (23%) Apple Valley (15%) Eagan (11%)

Our Volunteers

We had over 175 volunteers helping out with our riding programs, special events, and ranch projects:

Children's Program = 3939 hours Veteran's Program = 1160 hours Projects/Events = 943 hours

Total Volunteer Hours = 4746 Hours

MHR Heroes on Horseback Program

 Total number of injured military personnel, active duty and veterans in rehabilitation, that were served by the Heroes on Horseback Program: 30, 580 hours

Air Force 16% Army 47% Marine 6% Navy 28% Army National Guard 3%

- 97% of our veterans were male; 3% were female
- While multiple diagnosis were present, below are the top (4) four that affected our riders participating in the Heroes on Horseback Program: (Many have multiple secondary conditions.)

Our Horses

MHR owns 2 draft horses, 2 ponies, and 12 horses which are used in our riding programs. In 2019 these horses had a total of 1060 rider hours throughout the season. We also used select horses for 125 hours of Equine Facilitated Psychotherapy during the summer session.
